

Our activities in a nutshell during the year under review

- » Construction of ramp at the Vedanthangal birds sanctuary
- » 14 mobility aids distributed
- » 13 cataract surgeries performed
- » 1 training program conducted
- » 200 college students impacted on safe driving habits
- » 93 units of blood collected

# **PROGRAMS**

# 1.ADVOCACY

#### 1.1 CONSTRUCTION OF RAMP AT VEDANTHANGAL BIRDS SANCTUARY

Our advocacy efforts are geared towards sensitizing the policy makers, general public and

the media on the issues faced by the disabled. In pursuit of this mission, we approached the Tamil Nadu Forest Department for construction of a ramp at the Vedanthangal birds' sanctuary. The construction is underway and it should be completed before the sanctuary opens for the next season in December 2007.



#### 1.2 WORLD DISABLED DAY

The world disabled day was celebrated in a very grand manner. Mr. E. Shanmuga sundaram, Joint Director, Office of the State Commissioner for the Disabled was the Chief Guest. In his address, he elaborated on the Government schemes for the disabled. Mr. Vijay Kumar,



Advocate spoke on the legal status of the disabled. In his address, he emphasized the need for the implementation of the PWD Act. Assistive devices were also distributed to the disabled. Disabled students from various institutions attended the program. A gift hamper was given to all the participants.

## 3.0 WORKSHOPS

A full day workshop on the role of illustrators in the print media was conducted in March. Mrs Hemalatha Rajan, Director, Ma Foi Management Consultants P Ltd inaugurated the workshop. Artist Shyam, a renowned name in the South Indian vernacular print media, was the resource person. 43 disabled artists participated in the workshop. This workshop gave a wide exposure to the



participants to the various techniques in illustrating for stories, jokes and in taking up art as a profession. In the valedictory function, Dr Nanditha Krishna, Hon. Director, C P Art Center distributed certificates to all the participants. The participants were very happy with the workshop and said that it was a good learning experience for them. They also said that though they had attended many competitions in the past and even won prizes but they have never attended any workshop of this kind that hones their skills. The participants were also given a kit containing art materials. This workshop was jointly organized with Maithri Educational and Charitable Trust.

# 4.0 PREVENTION OF DISABILITY

#### 4.1 ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN

Disability caused by road accidents is on the rise. As part of our mission to prevent disability, we have conducted a road safety campaign addressing a gathering of 200 NSS volunteers from various city colleges. The power point presentation has animations on safe driving habits and statistical data on road accidents in Chennai.

#### **4.2 EYE CAMP**

An eye camp was organized at Mappedu village near Tandalam, 80 kms from Chennai. 105 persons over the age of 60 were screened. 28 were referred for surgery and 13 cataract surgeries were performed.



#### **OTHER ACTIVITIES**

93 units of blood collected.

A guest lecture was delivered by the Founder at the State level workshop on sensitizing the officials on rehabilitation of the woman disabled.


